FULL-SERVICE HOMESCHOOL MATH PROGRAM

Enrollment Agreement, Terms, and Program Policies

Effective Academic Year: 2026-2027

This Enrollment Agreement, Terms, and Program Policies document ("Agreement") governs enrollment in the Full-Service Homeschool Math Program offered by Infinity - The Math Institute ("Infinity").

By enrolling a student, signing this Agreement, checking an electronic acknowledgment box, submitting payment, or permitting a student to participate after receiving these terms, the enrolling parent or legal guardian ("Parent") acknowledges that the Parent has read, understands, and agrees to these terms on behalf of the Parent and enrolled student ("Student").

This Agreement explains what Infinity agrees to provide, the responsibilities of the Parent and Student, and which accommodations or exceptions Infinity may provide at its discretion.

1. What Is Required and What Is Discretionary

Throughout this Agreement, the words "will" and "shall" describe obligations or standard program features that Infinity agrees to provide, subject to the terms of this Agreement.

The words "may," "can," "generally," "typically," "when available," "at Infinity's discretion," and similar language describe services, accommodations, exceptions, or decisions that are not guaranteed.

Infinity may make reasonable exceptions because of illness, travel, emergencies, unusual hardship, technical circumstances, or other situations. An exception does not change the underlying policy, create a right to future exceptions, or require Infinity to provide the same exception to another family.

PART I. PROGRAM AND ENROLLMENT

2. Program Purpose

The Infinity Full-Service Homeschool Math Program is a structured online mathematics program providing live instruction, assignments, assessments, grading, attendance tracking, progress reporting, and course documentation.

Parents remain responsible for their child's overall homeschool program and for complying with applicable homeschool laws where the Student resides. Infinity is responsible for providing the enrolled mathematics course as described in this Agreement.

Enrollment in Infinity does not transfer the Parent's legal responsibility for homeschooling to Infinity.

3. Available Courses

For the 2026-2027 academic year, Infinity offers the following Full-Service Homeschool courses:

Foundations of Middle School Math ("Basic Math")

Builds the mathematical foundation students need after elementary mathematics and before Pre-Algebra.

Pre-Algebra

Strengthens middle school mathematics and prepares students for Algebra 1.

Algebra 1

Provides a complete Algebra 1 foundation and prepares students for higher-level mathematics.

Geometry, Algebra 2, and Precalculus are planned for 2027 or later but are not guaranteed until Infinity formally opens enrollment.

Course placement is based primarily on mathematical readiness rather than age or grade level.

4. Placement Assessment

Students are expected to complete an Infinity placement assessment before enrollment unless Infinity determines that sufficient placement information is already available.

Infinity will use assessment results and other relevant academic information to recommend the course it believes is most appropriate for the Student.

If later performance indicates that the Student has been placed at an inappropriate level, Infinity may recommend a change when academically appropriate and space permits.

Parents may discuss placement recommendations with Infinity. Infinity reserves the right to establish prerequisites or decline placement in a course that it reasonably determines is not appropriate for the Student's demonstrated readiness.

PART II. PROGRAM TERM AND WEEKLY STRUCTURE

5. Nine-Month Academic Program

The Full-Service Homeschool Math Program generally runs for nine months, approximately September through May. Specific dates, holidays, breaks, examination periods, and class times will be communicated for each academic year or class section.

Enrollment is for the full course term, even when tuition is paid monthly.

Students may enroll after the course begins when space and placement permit. Infinity may prorate or modify the payment schedule for late enrollment, but the Student remains enrolled for the remainder of the applicable course term.

Before classes begin, Infinity will provide orientation information explaining how to access live classes, submit work, complete assessments, use Thursday support, communicate with Infinity, and access parent reports.

6. Standard Weekly Schedule

The standard instructional week is:

Monday: 50-minute live mathematics lesson

Tuesday: 50-minute live mathematics lesson

Wednesday: 50-minute live mathematics lesson

Thursday: Optional live homework help, review, additional instruction, and assessment preparation

Friday: Assessment Day

Weekend: Completion of outstanding homework and assessments

Monday at 9:00 a.m. Pacific Time: Final submission cutoff for the preceding week's required work

Monday through Wednesday are the primary live instructional days. Students are expected to attend consistently, arrive prepared, participate appropriately, take notes, ask questions, and have the necessary course materials available.

Thursday's live support session is optional and may be used for homework questions, review, corrections, extra practice, makeup assistance, or assessment preparation. Students will receive Thursday attendance credit by satisfying the homework requirement described later in this Agreement.

Friday is Assessment Day. Students will typically receive at least three assessments or assessment components, although the number and type may vary based on curriculum pacing. These may include lesson quizzes, unit examinations, midterms, finals, cumulative assessments, or other appropriate evaluations.

Some assessments may be timed, while others may emphasize accuracy, reasoning, mastery, or completion. Infinity will communicate applicable testing expectations when necessary.

PART III. HOMEWORK, DEADLINES, AND ASSESSMENT

7. Weekly Work and Deadline

Students are expected to complete all assigned homework, quizzes, examinations, and other required work each week.

Infinity may refer to the weekly deadline as "Sunday night." For purposes of this Agreement, however, all required work must be submitted no later than Monday at 9:00 a.m. Pacific Time unless Infinity expressly establishes a different deadline.

The Sunday-night-to-Monday-morning period is a submission buffer, not an extension of the instructional week. Families outside the Pacific Time Zone are responsible for converting the deadline to their local time.

8. Homework and Course Materials

Students are expected to complete assigned homework and independent practice carefully and honestly.

Infinity will provide or designate the core materials required for the Student's course, including:

- Student textbook or lesson materials
- Assigned homework and practice
- Quizzes and unit examinations
- Midterm and final examinations
- Applicable study guides and review materials

Supplemental instructional resources and videos may be provided when available.

Video lessons are supplemental unless Infinity expressly states otherwise and are not guaranteed for every lesson.

9. Late and Missing Work

Work submitted after Monday at 9:00 a.m. Pacific Time is late unless Infinity has approved another deadline.

Infinity may accept late work, apply a penalty or partial credit, require corrections or additional work, or establish another reasonable completion requirement.

Repeated late or missing work may affect grades, attendance or participation records, certificate eligibility, and course-completion documentation.

Any exception granted for late work is discretionary and does not change future deadlines.

10. Retakes and Corrections

Infinity may offer retakes or correction opportunities for selected assessments, but retakes are not guaranteed.

Before permitting a retake, Infinity may require the Student to complete missing work, correct the original assessment, attend Thursday support, complete additional practice, show written work, explain errors, or otherwise demonstrate adequate preparation.

Infinity may establish limits on the timing, number, format, or maximum score of retakes.

PART IV. ATTENDANCE, PARTICIPATION, AND STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

11. Attendance

Infinity will maintain attendance and participation records for the Student's mathematics course. Students will earn attendance credit for all five instructional days each week when the following requirements are satisfied:

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday: Students are expected to attend the scheduled live lesson. If a Student cannot attend live, attendance credit will still be earned when the Student satisfactorily completes the lesson through an available recording, the Infinity textbook and course materials, instruction with a Parent or responsible adult, independent study, or another method approved by Infinity.

When a lesson is completed outside the live class, the Student or Parent must notify Infinity so the attendance record can be updated. Infinity may request reasonable confirmation of completion.

Thursday: Attendance credit will be earned through satisfactory completion of the required homework. Attendance at the optional Thursday support session is not required for Thursday attendance credit.

Friday: Attendance credit will be earned through satisfactory and timely completion of the assigned assessments.

Work that is substantially incomplete, not meaningfully attempted, or otherwise inadequate may not qualify for attendance credit.

When these requirements are satisfied, the Student's Infinity mathematics records will reflect attendance for all five instructional days of the week. Infinity may distinguish between live attendance, makeup instruction, homework participation, and assessment participation in its records.

12. Missed Live Classes and Makeup Attendance

A Student who misses a Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday live lesson remains responsible for completing the missed instruction and associated work.

Infinity does not guarantee that every class will be recorded. When a recording is unavailable, the Student may use the textbook, lesson materials, Parent instruction, Thursday support, or another approved method to complete the lesson.

Completing a missed lesson does not automatically extend homework or assessment deadlines. Infinity may approve alternate arrangements when circumstances warrant, but such accommodations are discretionary unless otherwise required by law.

13. Academic Honesty

Students must complete assessments honestly and independently unless Infinity expressly authorizes assistance, collaboration, notes, calculators, or other resources.

Prohibited conduct includes unauthorized assistance, copying another Student's work, using unauthorized answer keys or solution services, sharing assessment questions or answers, having another person complete work, using prohibited artificial intelligence or other technology, or otherwise misrepresenting work as the Student's own.

Infinity may invalidate, reduce, or require a retake of work that it reasonably believes does not reflect the Student's own performance. Repeated or serious academic dishonesty may result in additional academic consequences or removal from the program.

14. Student Conduct

Students are expected to participate respectfully and without interfering with instruction or the learning of others.

Prohibited conduct includes harassment, bullying, threats, discriminatory or abusive language, deliberate or repeated disruption, inappropriate material, unauthorized access to accounts or course systems, unauthorized recording or distribution of classes, impersonation, or conduct creating a safety or security concern.

Infinity may address minor concerns through parent communication, warnings, or reasonable restrictions. Serious or repeated misconduct may result in removal from a class, suspension, or termination of enrollment.

Infinity will generally communicate with the Parent before terminating enrollment for conduct unless the seriousness or urgency of the situation requires immediate action.

PART V. GRADING AND ACADEMIC RECORDS

15. Grading

Student grades may include homework, quizzes, unit examinations, midterm and final examinations, attendance, participation, and other designated academic work.

Infinity's standard grading scale is:

A: 90-100%

B: 80-89%

C: 70-79%

D: 60-69%

F: Below 60%

Infinity may establish weighting among assignment categories and will communicate any material grading structure applicable to the course.

16. Parent Reports and Academic Records

Infinity will maintain organized records for the Student's mathematics course and will provide:

- Unit progress reports
- Quarterly mathematics reports
- Attendance and participation records
- Mathematics instructional-hour summaries
- Assignment and assessment records
- Midyear and final course documentation

The Quarter 2 report will ordinarily serve as the Student's midyear or midterm progress report, and the Quarter 4 report will ordinarily serve as the comprehensive final or year-end report.

Reports and records may be delivered electronically.

17. Instructional Hours and Participation

Infinity will track mathematics-related instructional activity using live-class attendance, makeup lessons, homework, assessments, optional support attendance when applicable, and other documented course participation.

Independent work that Infinity does not directly observe may be estimated or documented through completed assignments and other available records.

Infinity tracks only the mathematics instruction and participation associated with its program. Parents remain responsible for any broader homeschool attendance, instructional-hour, or other subject-area records required by their jurisdiction.

18. Work Samples and Portfolio Support

Infinity will provide reasonable mathematics documentation that families may use for homeschool records and portfolios.

Because some work may be completed or graded electronically, Infinity does not guarantee a corrected work sample for every assignment. Midyear and final records may include representative work, assessment summaries, mastery information, or similar evidence of progress.

Families with unusual documentation requirements should notify Infinity as early as possible. Infinity may assist when reasonably practical but does not guarantee compliance with every format required by a particular jurisdiction, evaluator, school, or other third party.

PART VI. COURSE COMPLETION AND CERTIFICATES

19. Certificate of Completion

A Student will earn an Infinity Certificate of Completion by:

- Earning at least 60% overall in the course
- Earning at least 50% on the final examination
- Completing the required major assessments
- Meeting basic participation and assignment expectations

The certificate documents successful course completion and a basic demonstrated understanding of the material.

20. Certificate of Mastery

A Student will earn an Infinity Certificate of Mastery by:

- Earning at least 80% overall in the course
- Earning at least 75% on the final examination
- Completing all major assessments
- Demonstrating strong understanding of the course material

The Certificate of Mastery recognizes a higher level of academic performance.

Infinity certificates document course completion or achievement and are not diplomas or government-issued credentials.

21. Final Course Record Packet

At the completion of the course, Infinity will provide a Final Course Record Packet or equivalent final documentation.

The packet may include the Student's:

- Course description and final grade
- Attendance and instructional-hour summary
- Assignment and assessment summary
- Midterm and final examination scores
- Skills, topics, and standards covered
- Representative work or progress summary
- Certificate of Completion or Mastery, if earned
- Suggested transcript wording

The format may change over time, but the purpose will remain to provide an organized record of the Student's Infinity mathematics course.

PART VII. PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES AND HOMESCHOOL STATUS

22. Parent Responsibility for Homeschool Compliance

Infinity may serve families throughout the United States and internationally. Parents remain responsible for understanding and complying with the homeschool and education requirements applicable where the Student resides.

Infinity provides mathematics instruction and related documentation but does not provide legal advice or assume responsibility for the family's overall homeschool compliance.

Parent responsibilities may include:

- Filing required homeschool notices or registrations
- Maintaining overall homeschool and attendance records
- Tracking subjects and instructional time outside Infinity
- Preparing transcripts or portfolios when required
- Arranging required evaluations or standardized testing
- Determining homeschool credit
- Completing any other government, school, or legal requirements

Parents are responsible for determining whether Infinity's documentation is sufficient for their particular jurisdiction or educational purpose.

23. Infinity Is Not the Student's School of Record

Infinity - The Math Institute provides mathematics instruction and educational services but is not presently an accredited K-12 school or diploma-granting institution.

Enrollment does not make Infinity the Student's legal school of record.

Infinity grades, certificates, reports, attendance records, course descriptions, and completion documentation may be used to support homeschool records, portfolios, placement decisions, or parent-created transcripts when appropriate. The Parent remains responsible for determining how those materials may lawfully be used.

24. Parent Participation

Parents are not expected to reteach the mathematics course but are expected to provide reasonable oversight appropriate to the Student's age and independence.

This includes helping ensure that the Student attends or makes up lessons, has functioning technology, completes assignments and assessments, meets deadlines, follows academic-honesty rules, and responds to academic concerns.

Parents should review Infinity reports and communicate with Infinity when questions or concerns arise.

PART VIII. TECHNOLOGY AND ONLINE PARTICIPATION

25. Technology Requirements

Because the program is delivered online, the family is responsible for providing reliable internet access, a suitable device, access to required course platforms, audio capability, and the ability to view instructional materials and submit work.

A computer is strongly recommended. A tablet or phone may be used as a backup or supplemental device.

A functioning camera and microphone are recommended and may be required for certain activities, assessments, conferences, or participation expectations.

The Parent is responsible for the Student's internet service, device functionality, software compatibility, and other home technology. Personal technology problems do not automatically excuse missed classes or deadlines, although Infinity may provide a discretionary accommodation when appropriate.

26. Class Recordings

Infinity may record selected live classes for educational, training, quality-control, or makeup purposes when appropriate and legally permissible.

Infinity does not guarantee that every class will be recorded or that recordings will remain available for any specific period.

Students and Parents may not record, reproduce, publish, livestream, distribute, or share Infinity classes without prior written permission.

PART IX. TUITION, PAYMENT, AND CANCELLATION

27. Regular Tuition

Standard Full-Service tuition is:

Monthly Plan: \$199 per month for nine months (\$1,791 total)

or

Full-Course Upfront Plan: \$1,499 for the nine-month course

The upfront price reflects a discount for payment of the full course term in advance.

28. Promotions and Special Pricing

Infinity may periodically offer promotional pricing, discount codes, Founding Family rates, scholarships, referral discounts, or other special offers.

Promotions may have separate eligibility requirements, deadlines, or conditions. Unless expressly stated otherwise, promotional enrollment remains subject to this Agreement.

29. Monthly Payment Plan

The monthly plan is a payment schedule for the full nine-month course and is not a month-to-month subscription.

The Parent authorizes recurring billing according to the applicable enrollment schedule. Failure to attend classes, complete work, or use the program does not automatically cancel the payment obligation.

30. Full-Course Upfront Payment

Families choosing the upfront plan receive the discounted full-course price in exchange for payment for the complete nine-month term.

Unused prepaid tuition is not automatically refundable if a family voluntarily withdraws. Infinity may approve a partial refund, credit, transfer, or other accommodation in exceptional circumstances at its discretion, subject to any rights required by applicable law.

31. Early Withdrawal From the Monthly Plan

A family using the monthly plan remains committed to the full course term.

If the family voluntarily withdraws before the end of the course, one additional monthly cancellation payment will be due.

For families paying the standard rate, the cancellation payment is \$199. Promotional enrollment may be subject to the cancellation amount established by the applicable promotional terms.

32. Nonpayment

Failure to make a required payment may result in suspension of course access or live instruction, release of the Student's class seat, termination of enrollment, or collection of amounts properly due.

Infinity may offer a grace period or payment arrangement at its discretion. Any such accommodation does not waive future payment obligations.

PART X. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND COURSE MATERIALS

33. Ownership of Infinity Materials

Infinity's curriculum and educational materials are proprietary intellectual property. Infinity retains all applicable rights in its textbooks, lessons, assignments, assessments, answer keys, study guides, videos, graphics, course documents, curriculum structure, teaching materials, proprietary methods, and branded materials.

Enrollment provides only a limited right for the enrolled Student and Parent to use these materials for the Student's personal educational participation in the course.

Enrollment does not transfer ownership of Infinity's curriculum or materials.

34. Prohibited Use and Distribution

Without Infinity's prior written permission, Students and Parents may not sell, republish, publicly upload, distribute, reproduce for others, share restricted assessments or answer keys, share account credentials, create unauthorized commercial derivative materials, or use Infinity materials to operate another tutoring, school, pod, microschool, course, or educational business.

Reasonable personal use or printing for the enrolled Student's own education is permitted when allowed by the course platform or material.

PART XI. RESULTS, WARRANTIES, AND PROGRAM LIMITATIONS

35. No Guarantee of Academic Outcome

Infinity is committed to providing high-quality mathematics instruction and support, but academic results depend on many factors outside Infinity's control, including attendance, effort, prior preparation, completed work, study habits, testing performance, and individual circumstances.

Infinity does not guarantee any particular grade, assessment or standardized-test score, level of improvement, future course placement, school or college admission, academic credit, diploma eligibility, or other educational or career outcome.

Student success depends substantially on participation, effort, and completion of the required work.

36. Standards and Third-Party Acceptance

Infinity's curriculum is designed with reference to major mathematics standards and established middle school and Algebra expectations.

Infinity does not guarantee how any state, country, school, district, evaluator, college, accreditor, or other third party will recognize or accept Infinity coursework, grades, instructional hours, certificates, or records. Those decisions are controlled by the applicable third party.

PART XII. OPERATIONAL CHANGES AND DISCRETION

37. Reasonable Program Changes

Infinity may make reasonable academic, technological, scheduling, staffing, reporting, assessment, or administrative changes when necessary to improve instruction or operate the program effectively.

Infinity will not use this provision to eliminate the essential Full-Service nature of the program while continuing to charge families for a materially different service.

Material changes affecting a family's basic enrollment terms will be communicated when reasonably practical.

38. Instructor Cancellation or Program Interruption

If a scheduled live class cannot be provided as planned, Infinity may offer a rescheduled or replacement class, recorded lesson, alternate instructional activity, modified assignment schedule, or other reasonable substitute.

Infinity will use reasonable efforts to preserve the educational value of the missed instruction.

39. Events Outside Infinity's Reasonable Control

Infinity will not be considered in breach of this Agreement for delays or interruptions caused by circumstances reasonably outside its control, including major technology or internet failures, natural disasters, severe weather, government action, public emergencies, serious illness, power failures, or comparable events.

Infinity will make reasonable efforts to resume or replace affected instruction when practical.

PART XIII. LEGAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE TERMS

40. Communication

Parents are responsible for keeping their contact information current. Infinity may communicate through email, text, telephone, the course platform, parent portal, or other reasonable means.

Written communication is encouraged for significant matters involving grades, attendance, payment, placement, discipline, or disputes.

41. Discretionary Exceptions and No Waiver

Infinity may make reasonable exceptions because of illness, travel, emergencies, hardship, or other circumstances.

An exception does not permanently change the policy, create a right to future exceptions, require the same accommodation for another family, or waive Infinity's right to enforce the original policy later.

Any permanent modification to a family's contractual obligations must be confirmed in writing by Infinity.

42. Governing Law

Infinity - The Math Institute is based in Nevada. To the fullest extent legally permitted, this Agreement is governed by Nevada law, and disputes that may lawfully be required to proceed in Nevada shall be brought in an appropriate Nevada court.

Nothing in this Agreement waives rights that cannot legally be waived under applicable law. Out-of-state and international families remain responsible for determining whether participation is lawful and appropriate where they reside.

43. Limitation of Certain Damages

To the fullest extent permitted by law, Infinity will not be liable for indirect, incidental, special, punitive, exemplary, or consequential damages arising from participation in or inability to participate in the program.

This provision does not limit liability where prohibited by law.

44. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement is found invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will remain in effect to the extent legally permitted.

45. Entire Agreement

This Agreement, together with the Student's enrollment information, payment selection, academic calendar, and applicable written promotional terms, constitutes the agreement between Infinity and the Parent regarding the Full-Service Homeschool Math Program.

A specific written promotional term controls only the provision it expressly modifies. Informal conversations or discretionary exceptions do not permanently amend this Agreement.

46. Updates to Policies

Infinity may update policies for future enrollment periods and may make reasonable administrative or academic updates during an active course when necessary for operation, safety, technology, legal compliance, or educational integrity.

Infinity will not impose a materially different financial obligation on an already enrolled family without the Parent's agreement unless required by law.

PART XIV. PARENT/GUARDIAN ACKNOWLEDGMENT

47. Parent/Guardian Acknowledgment

By electronically accepting this Agreement, the Parent acknowledges that:

1. The Parent has read, understands, and agrees to this Agreement on behalf of the Parent and Student.
2. The Student is enrolling in a structured nine-month mathematics program. Monthly payments are installments on the full course commitment and are not a month-to-month subscription.
3. The Parent understands the weekly program structure, including Monday through Wednesday live instruction, optional Thursday support, Friday assessments, and the requirement that weekly work be submitted no later than Monday at 9:00 a.m. Pacific Time unless Infinity establishes another deadline.
4. The Parent understands the attendance, grading, academic-honesty, conduct, assessment, and course-completion requirements described in this Agreement.
5. The Parent understands that Infinity will provide mathematics instruction, progress reporting, attendance and instructional records, and course documentation as described in this Agreement.
6. The Parent understands that Infinity is not presently an accredited K-12 school or diploma-granting institution and is not the Student's legal school of record. The Parent remains responsible for applicable homeschool and education requirements.
7. The Parent understands the applicable tuition, payment, withdrawal, promotional-pricing, and refund provisions and acknowledges that Infinity does not guarantee any particular academic or educational outcome.
8. The Parent agrees to protect Infinity's proprietary curriculum and materials and understands that discretionary exceptions do not permanently modify the policies in this Agreement.

The Parent acknowledges having had the opportunity to ask questions before enrollment.

Electronic Acceptance

Enrollment requires the Parent or legal guardian to affirmatively accept this Agreement through Infinity's online enrollment process.
